

Mrs. Blackburn's honor and recognition include an award for the Professionals (a modeling troupe), 'Designer of the Year' by the Flamingo's (a civic and social club), 'Designer of the Year,' and a recipient of Harvey's Bristol Cream Tribute to Black Designers. Her mother, Mrs. Minnie Coles resides in Lynchburg, Virginia.

Education and Chemical Research


Dr. Diuguid is a graduate of Dunbar High School (1934). He also graduated from West Virginia State College *magna cum laude*) and Cornell University. His field of study at these institutions was Organic Chemistry.

Dr. Diuguid's professional experiences include: teaching Chemistry at various colleges; Research Associate in Organic Chemistry at Cornell University; and Research Associate at Jewish Hospital in St. Louis, Missouri (Leukemia Research). Additionally, he is the founder of the Du-Good Chemica!

Laboratory in St. Louis. The Staff has developed a number of useful products, such as waterless hand cleaner, detergent, liniment, after shave, pincurl creme, and a facial creme. He has trained over 100 young black chemists in the laboratory and has assisted many blacks in getting jobs as chemists.

Dr. Diuguid is the author or co-author of some scientific articles that have been published in such periodicals as Journal of the American Chemical Society, Annals of Biochemistry, and Journal of Clinical Medicine. Also, he has presented papers at scientific meetings.

Dr. Diuguid is a member of the Board of Directors, Leukemia Guild of Missouri and Illinois, and had been the recipient of the Carver Civic Award. He is listed in American Men of Science, Chemical Who's Who, and Who's Who in Technology.
