

Biographical Sketch

As a native of Lynchburg, Virginia, Dr. Graham N. Marshall attended the Lynchburg Public Schools and graduated from the following colleges: Virginia Seminary College, Bachelor of Arts; Virginia State College, Bachelor of Science; and The University of Virginia, Master of Education Degree. He received a Doctorate of Divinity Degree (honorary) from Baltimore College of Bible. He has done further study at Gettysburg College, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, and Lynchburg College, Lynchburg, Virginia.

Reverend Marshall was licensed to preach September 14, 1952 and was ordained in June of 1955 at The Rivermont Baptist Church where he served as assistant pastor until he was called to pastor Smokey Row Baptist Church of Staunton, Virginia, July 1956. He served as pastor of that church five and one half years and was called to the Olive Branch Church of Moneta, Virginia in November 1958. He remained there for six years. In March 1959, he was called to the pastorate of Grace Baptist Church of Altavista, Virginia and served that church for eleven years. Beginning in July of 1961, Rev. Graham was called to the Peaceful Grove Baptist Church, Concord, Virginia where he served for six and one half years. In December of 1961, he was called to the Saint Andrew's Baptist Church of Cullen, Virginia and in February of 1968, Nazareth Baptist Church of Phenix, Virginia. He served both churches until August, 1975. He was called to the pastorate of Mount Zion Baptist Church, Lynchburg. in May 1970. Mount Pleasant Baptist Church of Altavista, Virginia called him in September 1975; he is still pastoring both churches.

Rev. Marshall is the past Worshipful Master of the Star of The West Lodge #105 Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Free Masonry. He is Associate Patron of Good Will Chapter #125 Order of Eastern Star. He is listed in the 1967 edition of Outstanding Personalities of the South, and the 1976 edition of Who's Who in Virginia.

Rev. Marshall is married to Dorothy Jean Stuader of Haddenfield,
