Corporal James Carroll Wood enlisted in the United States Army in May 18, 1966, and began serving in November of that year. Stationed with the Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 101st Aviation Battalion, 101st Airborne Division, CPL Wood served as a paratrooper for a regular 12-month period and then volunteered to return for a second tour. After a 30 day leave in Rustburg, CPL Wood returned to Dinh Tuong as an Airborne/Pathfinder Qualified Infantryman with the Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 145th Aviation Battalion, 12th Aviation Group, 1st Aviation Brigade. In 1967, Wood received an Army Commendation Medal. In addition to a Purple Heart, he received an Air Medal and a Bronze Star with a "V" device for valor posthumously, in 1968.

James Carroll (J. C.) Wood was born in Lynchburg in 1947, to Harriette Anne Firkin and Carroll Emerson Wood, who served in World War II and the Korean War with the United States Air Force. J.C. Wood graduated from E. C. Glass High School. After his parents divorced, his mother married William Nelson Johnson in the 1960s. They subsequently moved to Rustburg, residing on Route 1. Their daughter, Sabrina Johnson Smith, commemorated J. C. in 2013, in a post on Wall of Faces titled "My hero, My brother." "I still remember," Smith wrote, "and miss you very much."
